## BOAT CAPTAINS REPORT

Our year started with a short meeting in July 2012 with Chris Armstrong, Lachy Andrews and Emma Flint. Chris indicated he wanted to row and would weigh up whether it was better to row Masters or Open, Emma wanted to row a full Victorian season and sent a lot of Facebook requests to see if she could attract any new members. Lachy wanted to play a small role due to work and Jason Kent would focus on work this season and was unable to commit.

Emma attracted Chelsea Rawnsdon and Chloe McIntyre, invitations were sent to Kate Conway, Ella & Linley Bertachinni and Maddie Pilgrim to come and train and a squad was formed. Emily Olson and Gracie Cartwright were added. Leah Schuback and Kelly Beanland started training and Kylie James also started to train with the group but was a bit hesitant due to her MS. Ashley Fernando & Tiesha Warry started training and after a bit of trial and error we formed the three women's crews for the year.

Angus Mason has stepped in to the Board and ski family and seemed to really enjoy his experience as a ski paddler. The transition period between nippers/cadets into juniors is where we find it difficult to maintain the competitors interest, for a number of reasons. After seeing firsthand the number of talented Nippers/ cadets the club has at the moment, It's imperative we find the time to keep developing these kids through the next phase of competition.

Unfortunately we didn't have any competitors compete at the Australian Titles this year. SLSA have delayed the titles to mid April, which makes it's difficult to keep training when Seaspray's weather starts to become a little uncomfortable. ## Life Saving Equipment Coordinator Report

The majority of our equipment costs for Life Saving Equipment for the past season were the replenishment of first aid room and grab bag stocks.

There was a number of outdated consumables which are used during day to day patrols that required replacing, particularly Bandages and saline and there was also limited supplies of Medical Oxygen and sterile equipment such as surgical scissors, tweezers etc.

With assistance from Esso Australia's VIP grant we replaced a spinal board which flew off in a helicopter with a spinal injury patient, we also purchased a set of extrication collars and a head immobilizer which will complement our spinal boards. We also fitted our new shark siren which thankfully hasn't needed to be used in anger.

A couple of areas we can focus on next year which may assist in maintaining stock levels:

The introduction of a live audit board where used items can be logged at the completion of each patrol day.

Educate patrol members in the administration of Ventolin with the use of spacers, which will enable us to sterilize the spacer after use, while retaining ventolin stocks.

Outdated or damaged medical stock will be supplied to the training officer for the use in patrol member training.

Congratulations to all patrols for their efforts to maintain a Spartan first aid room in a somewhat hygienic condition and the respect in which they used the lifesaving equipment. Our equipment is subjected to some harsh conditions and the care and maintenance it is given, will allow it to be in top condition when used in anger.






## BUILDING COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT 2012-2013








