Treasurers Report 2015/2016

This season has been tremendously busy and challenging for me in the role of treasurer.

With the building project progressing to completion, we needed to finalise the grants and expenditure for our building project, as well as more fundraising to help furnish and finish the new clubhouse. We also implemented new sales technology at the commencement of trading at the new Sandbar and kitchen. These activities needed to be recorded and reported correctly to ensure that we were able to comply with all regulatory reporting obligations.

We have seen a very successful summer trading period, with the bar and kitchen proving to be very well patronised. This is our main source of income and it was great to see so many people supporting our new venture.

We raised more than \$210,000 from donations and fundraising activities and this has been utilised in the fit out and furnishing of our new building and for new equipment and patrol requirements.

Our sincere thanks go to the local businesses, organisations and general community who donated money and participated in our fundraising activities.

Combined trading this year of our general income and expenses and the new building project has seen a net loss of \$940,577. However this was budgeted for with the profit of \$812,035 from 2014-15 season and cash at bank at the commencement of the year covering the loss.

I would like to thank James, Barrie and the general committee for their ongoing support and their faith in me to undertake the role.

Please note that the financial records were not able to be audited prior to the issue of the annual report. The audited figures and report will be available to any member wishing to view them at the completion of the audit.

IRB accredited drivers are encouraged to practice driving during patrol times to sharpen skills and build confidence in big surf and rough conditions. There will be group training weekends in the future leading up to our next summer which is right around the corner.

It is with pleasure that I report the successful completion of Stage 1 of the new Club House. The contract works were completed on the 24th December in time for the Boxing Day opening. Actual project expenditure was \$2,451,813

The task is not over as we will require ongoing support to complete fit-out out the building to a standard commensurate with community expectations and further works that were deferred to Stage 2

Gear Stewards Report 2015/2016

As everyone is aware the 2015/2016 season was a hectic one with the demolition of the old club and the opening of our new home. It was encouraging to see the number of volunteers being involved with the project, particularly with relocation of equipment and memorabilia we have accumulated over the years, and the demolition and cleanup of the old club.

We faced some frustrations and challenges waiting for the confirmation of state funding to assist us with completion of the first aid and patrol rooms, however the funding has finally arrived, which will see these two important areas of our club completed and ready to go for next season.

Through funding sourced by the hard work of our Grants Officer, we have been able to purchase a number of essential items that will enable us to continue providing a service to the community. We have replenished our PFD and Helmet supplies for use on our patrol water craft, bought a Bennett's Rescue board and a number of rescue tubes, and also purchased a new first aid grab bag and consumables for our new first aid room.

Through the Generous donation of the Electrical Trades Union (ETU) Workers from the new Longford Gas Conditioning Plant, we were able to purchase two new Rescue Boards and competition High Vis tops. In addition to this we were able to complement our Emergency Rescue Teams equipment, by providing two Stormy Seas Jackets and two personal EPIRB's for use during Search and Rescue.

A big Thank You must go out to the ETU members who through weekly payroll deductions, are providing donations to organization's like ourselves, throughout the community.

Thank you also Exxon Mobil for once again allowing us to be a recipient of the Community VIP Grant. The grant will enable us to build a Search and Rescue storage area in our new building, so we can store our Search and Rescue clothing and equipment separate from our everyday gear. This will help keep this important kit in the best possible condition so it is ready to go in a Search and Rescue situation.

Once again the patrols have done a great job maintaining our gear. We often operate in a harsh and trying environment, and it's important our gear remains in good condition, for when the time comes, and we are called upon to put our training into action.
