Treasurers Report 2016 / 2017

I have had another very busy year in my role as Treasurer and I am pleased to provide the financial statements for the 2016/2017 season.

This year we finished with a net loss of \$13,283, compared to a net loss of \$934,598 the previous year.

We made our final payments for the completion of the new clubhouse which has contributed to the loss and we expect that we will return to a profit situation next season.

The lease arrangements for the operation of our bar and kitchen has been a great success and has produced income of approx. \$70,000 between November 2016 and June 2017. This venture has been strongly patronised with fantastic food and great atmosphere being offered resulting in a positive experience for the partnership between our club and Sale Community Bowls Club.

Prior to that arrangement the kitchen and bar was operated by club members for a period of time and this resulted in income of approx. \$48,260 which is also a terrific result. A big thank you to all of the volunteers who gave their time and expertise to make that run smoothly.

Our fundraising activities has also produced strong income through raffles, BBO's, Bowls night, table sponsorships and the \$2,000 club which has received ongoing support. Thanks to everyone involved in our fundraising activities.

I would also like to thank the committee members who have supported me in my role and I look forward to another year in the role.

Note 1: Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

These financial statements cover Seaspray Surf Life Saving Club Inc as an individual entity. Seaspray Surf Life Saving Club Inc is an incorporated association.

Basis of Preparation

The committee has determined that the entity is not a reporting entity. This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared for the purpose of fulfilling the committee's reporting requirements.

The financial report has been prepared on an cash basis and is based on historic costs, except where otherwise stated.

(a) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office.

The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is reflected as a receivable or payable on the Balance Sheet.

(b) Comparative Figures

Comparative figures in the Profit and Loss Statement may not agree due to change in account classifications.

(c) Revenue and other income

Non-reciprocal grant revenue is recognised in the profit or loss when the entity obtains control (ordinarily the receipt of) of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the entity and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

Revenue from the sale of goods and rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the goods or service to the customer.

Donations, fundraising revenue and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

(d) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less.

To the Members of Seaspray Surf Lifesaving Club Inc

Qualified Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial report, being a special purpose financial report, of Seaspray Surf Lifesaving Club Inc ("the Entity"), which comprises of the profit and loss statement, balance sheet, statement of cash flows and the statement of changes in equity for the year ending 30 June 2017, notes comprising a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information, and the committee declaration.

In our opinion, except for the possible effects of the matters described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion paragraph, the financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of Seaspray Surf Lifesaving Club Inc as at 30 June 2017, in accordance with the cash basis.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

Revenue

It is impracticable to establish controls over all monies received prior to entry into the financial records. Accordingly, as the evidence available to audit regarding revenue was limited, our audit procedures were restricted to the amounts recorded in the financial records and we are therefore unable to express an opinion on whether the recorded revenue is free of material misstatement.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report* section of our report. We are independent of the Entity in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 *Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants* (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Again we utilized the Seaspray Hall it was a great set up in the end and appreciate all the work from everyone the cooks, trainers, helpers and those that assisted through the week.

Warren had done some great work with the patrols and soon added all the Bronze's into their patrols, and had a workable first aid room. Our Patrol tower has been made and will have power connected over the next month and a few finishing touches this will make keeping our beach safe a lot easier this season. Broaches were rare and the boats hull was never sited all year with the crew's ability to negotiate surf with some cracking trails on the return journey a highlight when competing.

A new u/19 fillies crew made their debut at Seaspray after 18 months development rowing at the Port of Sale, Merriman's creek, Seaspray beach, Tidal river at Wilsons Prom and Marlay Point. This was also supplemented with gym sessions that contained running, ergos, weights and fitness circuits used to develop fitness and groom strokes.
