<p>Welcome and discussion:</p> <p>LSV requested Seaspray update their constitution in 2017 to comply with the 2012 Associations Act.</p> <p>LSV provide a CVA compliant template for club to draft their new rules.</p> <p>Process to update the constitution started with new template, reference to the old paragraphs were provide in draft Constitution distributed with Special meeting invite.</p> <p>All members were invited to Special general meeting, ad was placed in paper, plus weekly newsletter and social media.</p> <p>The LSV template referenced a smaller board of management, appointing directors rather than a committee, this concept has been adopted in the draft.</p> <p>The LSV template strips some of the rules which require more flexibility to be placed in the By-Laws (By-Laws still need to be approved at a General Meeting, but is not a constitutional change), this has been adopted in the draft.</p> <p>The club committee formed a sub-committee of Leanne McDonald, Marty Jackson and Amanda Castle to initiate the process of updating the constitution, they reviewed other clubs rules and worked on a revised Org structure.</p> <p>The Revised structure was discussed an additional committee meeting on the 25th June, at this meeting the committee agreed to present the draft Constitution along with the update By-Laws to the Special General Meeting for approval.</p> <p>The revised Organisational structure has Ten (10) directorship roles which make up the up the board.</p> <p>The members agreed on the fundamental constitutional changes presented in the draft, noting the need to update the page reference.</p> <p>This was followed by more detailed discussion on the By-Laws. Minor amendments included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Add page numbers to By-Laws, update contents page.• 8.1 update by-Law reference• 8.5 Change "the board" to the "the Director"• 8.7 Change "New" to New operational", take out Assessment Co-Ordinator• 8.8 Update for Patrol Co-Ordinator, Members Program• 9.2.1 Update Title to Patrol Captains, take out. Must have at least 5 years Active Patrol Duty, must have obtained the relevant Training Officer Certificates. Move. Responsible for the rostering and management of patrols to Director of Lifesaving Services.

Thank you to all our members for their continued support for our great club which continues to mature and settle into a successful operation both on and off the beach.

Our volunteers continue to come together to keep our beaches safe and we know we do this best when we are well trained and ready for service, this also means making sure our facilities are fit for purpose.

The work done this year to upgrade the bathroom facilities and then later the patrol room goes a long way to making sure we can service our members and community. Notes to the financial statements

For the year ended 30 June 2019

The financial statements cover Seaspray Surf Life Saving Club as an individual entity. Seaspray Surf Life Saving Club is a not-for-profit association incorporated in Victoria under the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 ('the Act').

Comparatives are consistent with prior years, unless otherwise stated.

1 Basis of preparation

In the opinion of the Committee of Management, the association is not a reporting entity since there are unlikely to exist users of the financial statements who are not able to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs. These special purpose financial statements have been prepared to meet the reporting requirements of the Act.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements of the Australian Accounting Standards and Accounting Interpretations, and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 Presentation of Financial Statements, AASB 107 Statement of Cash Flows, AASB 108 Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors and AASB 1054 Australian Additional Disclosures.

Significant accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are presented below and are consistent with prior reporting periods unless otherwise stated.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and are based on historical costs modified, where applicable, by the measurement at fair value of selected non-current assets, financial assets and financial liabilities.

The following significant accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless stated otherwise, have been adopted in the preparation of this financial report.

2 Summary of significant accounting policies

Income tax

The association is exempt from income tax under Division 50 of the *Income Tax Assessment Act 1997*.

Goods and services tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Taxation Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of GST.

Revenue and other income

Revenue is recognised when the amount of the revenue can be measured reliably, it is probable that economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Association and specific criteria relating to the type of revenue as noted below, has been satisfied.

Revenue is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable and is presented net of returns, discounts and rebates.

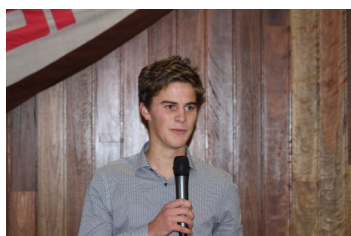

NIPPERS REPORT

NIPPERS REPORT 2018 / 2019

This year's Nippers program was structured specifically around teaching kids basic lifesaving skills required to be safe around an aquatic environment as well as developing their skills to compete in surf sports for kids aged from 5 to 14 years. The program was based on FUN and EDUCATION. Over the last few years we have recognised that young people have varying learning abilities so we implemented skills based groups rather than age groups. We found this to be beneficial in fast tracking the development of the more competent kids whilst encouraging the other kids who lacked the confidence in the water. Every effort was made to cater for these abilities within the program. Nippers were encouraged to participate in all parts of Surf life saving including water and beach activities. BUILDING COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT 2018-2019

It is with pleasure that I submit my report on the activities of the building committee for season 2018-2019.

After an inspection of our clubhouse facilities by Life Saving Victoria, we were granted \$30,000 to complete the fitout of the male and female toilets, the disabled facilities and the painting of the change rooms.

These works are now complete and the funds have been ratified.

The interior fitout of the patrol tower has also been completed making the tower fully operational.

This year we embarked on completing the patrol room and have installed a false ceiling. The final step is to have the interior painted, which is being done by our patrollers. When this is complete we will be able to display our club memorabilia on the walls. This project will give our younger members some ownership of their own space in the clubhouse.

We were pleased that after much discussion we were able to install heating and cooling systems in the bistro. This has proven very successful in making the bistro more enjoyable year round. We have also plastered the ceiling on the landing on the stairs leading to the bistro.

Currently, we are painting the new ceiling on the landing and stairs, as well as upgrading the nonslip tread on the staircase.

Double doors have been installed on the storage space in the front foyer so this space can be used effectively to store our club memorabilia and photos. This additional storage will free up the cupboard upstairs next to the lift for our merchandise.

The next project for the building committee is the provision of additional storage at the clubhouse for our equipment. Our equipment is housed in different locations in Sale and this project will ensure that all the equipment is stored together at the clubhouse.

I would like to thank all the members of the building committee for their input and hard work this season and I look forward to next season and the completion of further building projects.
